Safe Use of Insulin in the Hospital Setting: \$20

This course, taught by a certified diabetes educator, is designed for health care professionals and will discuss the complexities of insulin and glucose management in the inpatient setting. 4 CE's

Initiation and Management of Insulin and Incretin Therapy: \$100

Understand the proper use and purpose of all types of insulin and the incretin medications. Increase your knowledge of insulin pens, pumps and continuous glucose monitoring devices. Through case studies and practicum, you will examine initiating basal and bolus insulin as well as insulin adjustment. 7 CE's

The Fundamentals of Diabetes Management: \$100

You will learn the latest diabetes developments, medications, glucose and nutrition recommendations, as well as examine management and prevention of acute and chronic diabetes complications. 7 CE's

Demystifying the Diabetes Diet: \$100

Learn to formulate individual meal plans and how to calculate calories, carbohydrates, fats and protein. A food lab will help teach you how to determine insulin to carbohydrate ratios. 7 CE's

Comprehensive Diabetes Education and Clinical Management Program: \$675

This five-day program explores diabetes care, looking at the whole person including cultural adaptations, depression, behavior change modalities and teaching principals. Interactive case studies will teach you how to do a complete foot exam, manage blood pressure, lipids, glucose, and indentify, prevent and treat acute and chronic complications of diabetes. This course will cover metabolic syndrome, pre-diabetes, clinical research, and more. 35 CE's
